Lauren and I have just returned from a trip to Kenya, where we met 2 of our RISE fellows, Branice and Susan. This is a trip we never thought possible, when we were first forming RISE in the middle of the pandemic. Yet, here we are, two and a half years later, continuing this work only because of **your belief in us**. As travel slowly becomes more of a possibility, it's been an honor to meet with the incredible women you have helped support and hear the stories of how they've made their communities healthier and safer.

This year we've supported female entrepreneurs across India, Nepal, Indonesia, Zimbabwe and Kenya. Through their fellowships, 15,310 families have been provided with clean water, over 150,000 bars of soap have been distributed and more than 5,000 women have received reusable menstrual products enabling them to manage their periods safely. We also continued our long-term emergency support in Haiti, Nigeria, and right here in the US, supporting female refugees from Afghanistan.

On behalf of the women and communities you've supported, I want to say the biggest thank you. To our board members, our monthly donors, our RISE 100 members and our corporate sponsors, we are just so grateful for your financial support and encouragement. It has never been harder to do this work, and yet we were able to do it, thanks to you.

ABOUT RISE BY SUNDARA

RISE by Sundara searches the world to invest in the best and brightest female social entrepreneurs working in water, sanitation and hygiene. Each RISE fellow receives thousands of dollars of seed funding, mentorship and business resources from experts and coaches.



We support female entrepreneur in low to middle income countries.



RISE Fellows have a transformative idea for an initiative that will improve the water, sanitation and hygiene in their communities.



There is an income-generating aspect to our fellows' initiatives making their work financially sustainable long term.

EMERGENCY AID

Through our Emergency Aid program, we assist communities across the globe who need immediate, short-term relief. We have proudly reached over 900,000 people across the United States, Ghana, Uganda, Kenya, India, Rwanda, Nigeria, Haiti and South Africa.



We provided 1,500 refugees from the Bukompe Refugee Camp in Uganda with ceramic water purifiers, water tanks, and funds to construct two borehole wells.



We distributed bars of soap to over 2800 people in India requiring urgent access to sanitization methods during the initial outbreak of COVID.



We provided 60 students from a school in Old Odunasi, an rural village in Ghana, with immediate access to sinks and toilets.



We provided 500 people living below the federal poverty line in New York City with critical access to cleaning supplies, hand-soap, toiletries, diapers, and infant formula.



We distributed reusable face masks to 1000 families in India during the government mandated lockdowns.



We reached nearly 3,000 people from underserved communities in India with emergency food aid packages during the first outbreak of COVID.

JUNIOR, ZIMBABWE

Through becoming a RISE Fellow, Junior has been able to install two hygiene banks next to boreholes to support underserved communities in Zimbabwe. Junior's work enables thousands of marginalized families to access affordable soap, supporting them to prevent illnesses.



PURVI, INDIA

In India, 80% of women report using rags, sand, ash, leaves or hay to manage their periods. These methods are ineffective and unsanitary which cause infections. To combat this, Purvi is training women on the Indo-Bangladesh border to make and sell reusable cloth sanitary pads.



BRANICE, KENYA

Becoming a RISE Fellow has enabled Branice to provide full-time employment for 12 women, enable six communities to purchase soap and has created a sustainable self-sustaining enterprise that will allow her community to prevent illnesses for many years to come.



ROSHANI, NEPAL

Before becoming a RISE Fellow, Roshani 's organization was reliant on international donations to fund their work. Through joining RISE, Roshani has adopted an income generating model which will support her organization's sustainability and has increased access to menstural hygiene supplies in Nepal.



SUSAN, KENYA

Susan started a soap making initiative to support her community to wash their hands during the coronavirus pandemic. By becoming a RISE Fellow, Susan has scaled her business to employ 50 women who have sold over 400 litres of homemade soap to low-income families.



NUHA, INDONESIA

Nuha designed the SandBank water filter which removes metal ions from polluted water found in the mining communities of Bangka, Indonesia. Nuha has used the seed-funding RISE gave her to manufacture more filters and is working with her RISE mentors to scale her start-up.

COVID EMERGENCY AID

We partnered with local NGOs to provide emergency aid responses across India to provide urgent support for communities affected by the coronavirus pandemic.


